Randwick Barracks History

A long history

Long before European settlement, Aboriginal people lived and thrived in the area we now know as Randwick, with the Bidjigal and Gadigal clans occupying the Coogee area where Randwick Barracks is located today. The land at the Randwick Barracks site has been associated with Defence since the 1860s, and was used by the NSW Military Forces from the 1900s.

The School of Musketry Building at Randwick Barracks is historically significant for its association with the development of the Australian Army at the turn of the twentieth century and it is still in use today for administrative purposes.

Similarly, the former Officers' Mess remains in use, providing residential accommodation for Army officers. Randwick Barracks includes both these heritage assets and also a large expanse of vacant land, which has had multiple uses over time.

In 2010, 13.1 hectares of the Randwick Barracks site was handed to the Randwick City Council by Defence for use as community land. This site is now known as the Randwick Environment Park and Community Centre. It offers unique environmental experiences, educational resources and informal recreational activities for the local and wider community.

Today Randwick Barracks accommodates a number of Australian Defence Force elements including components of the Navy Systems Training Centre, Army Special Forces Command and the Army Reserve.
