#### Round 3 Snapshot

#### The SRS has been designed to:



Provide a holistic view of supplier performance and track supplier performance over time



Be a key input into decision-making



Provide Defence access to enhanced supplier insights, including feedback from suppliers on their performance and operations



Continue to promote and support constructive, transparent partnerships between suppliers and Defence



Evolve iteratively and mature over time, informed by ongoing review and consultation.

#### In Round 3 the SRS assessed:



316 Contracts







Biannual rounds across 6 month performance periods (October to March and April to September).



Survey data collected from contract managers drives the SRS rating at a contract level and is aggregated for a supplier rating.



Suppliers provide performance validation, contextual information and an assessment of Defence's performance.



Each supplier will receive an SRS rating reflecting their performance over the previous performance period.

The SRS is Defence's view of a supplier as the customer.



Connected, holistic view of supplier performance across contracts



Enable Defence to convert data into insights on delivery risks and opportunities



Create a basis to recognise suppliers consistently meeting or exceeding their contractual commitments




Provide suppliers a 'voice' by seeking suppliers' response to Defence assessment

- Your session will timeout after 60 minutes of navigation inactivity. Re-use the link on the email to re-enter. To commence the survey, please click Next.






