## DECLARATION AND DETERMINATION UNDER THE AUSTRALIAN OPERATIONAL SERVICE MEDAL REGULATION 2012

- I, QUENTIN ALICE LOUISE BRYCE, Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, pursuant to the Australian Operational Service Medal Regulation 2012 contained in the Schedule to Letters Patent dated 22 May 2012 ("the Regulations"), on the recommendation of the Minister for Defence, hereby:
- (a) declare, under regulation 3 of the Regulations, the following operation in which persons rendered service, in the area comprising the total land area, territorial waters and superjacent airspace of the Solomon Islands to be a declared operation for the purposes of the Regulations;
  - (i) Operation ANODE that commenced on 24 July 2003;
- (b) determine, under regulation 4 of the Regulations, that the conditions for award of the Australian Operational Service Medal (Civilian) with Clasp 'SOLOMON IS II' ("the Medal") for that declared operation are that:
  - (i) the Medal may be awarded to a civilian, as defined under regulation 2 of the Regulations, who was employed for duty as such a person of the declared operation for a period of not less than an aggregate of 30 days;
    - AND PROVIDED THAT where a person does not complete the *prescribed* period for the award of the Medal required by subparagraph b(i) owing to his or her death, evacuation due to illness, injury or other disability due to service, the person will be deemed to have completed that *prescribed* period;
- (c) determine, for the purposes of this determination, that a person is not eligible for an award of the Medal where an entitlement exists to another Australian medal for the same deployment.
