Admiralty Weekly Order 6 – 1914 Star – Issue.

(M.C. 17433/18 - 2.1.1919)

The 1914 Star is now ready for issue and applications on behalf of Officers and men entitled should be made to the Accountant General (Medal Branch) on Form S.540, stating for what service the claim is made.

- 2. The award is to the Officers and men of the R.N., R.M., R.N.A.S., R.N.R., and R.N.V.R. who actually served in France or Belgium between the 5th August and midnight 22nd/ 23rd November. The Star is not granted to any Officer or man employed on special or temporary shore service but not definitely appointed to a shore Unit.
- 3. Provided the claims are approved by the Admiralty, Officers and men of the following Naval Units are entitled to the Star:-

Naval Transport Staffs ashore.
Armoured Trains.
Naval Mission with Belgian Army.
Machine Gun Parties landed from H.M. Ships "Severn", "Mersey", and "Hunter".
R.N. Hospital, Dunkirk.
R.N.A.S., Dunkirk.
R.N.A.S., No. 1 and No. 3 Wings.
R.N.A.S., Armoured Cars.
R.M. Brigade, Ostend.
R.N. Division, Antwerp.

- 4. Those who have deserted or been dismissed with disgrace since the date of qualifying service will not be granted the Star
- 5. Application on behalf of those entitled to the Star for service with the Army will be made to the Secretary, War Office (Medal Branch), 27, Pilgrim Street, E.C.4. Stars are at present ready for issue to the Household Cavalry, Foot Guards and Highland Regiments only.

Admiralty Weekly Order 4036 – 17/12/1919 – Clasp to the "1914 Star" – Award.

(C.W. 3034/19 - 17.12.1919)

His Majesty the King having been pleased to approve the grant of a clasp to the Officers and men who have been awarded the '1914 Star' and who actually served under the fire of the enemy in France and Belgium between the 5th August, 1914, and midnight 22nd/ 23rd November, the following regulations for the award of the clasp are issued for information:-

- 1. The clasp will be in bronze and will bear the inscription: '5th Aug.-22nd Nov., 1914'.
- 2. In undress uniform when ribands are worn, the grant of a clasp will be denoted by the wearing of a small silver rose in the centre of the riband. Two small silver roses will be issued with each clasp.
- 3. Provided the claims are approved by the Admiralty, the clasp will be issued to Officers and men of the Royal Navy, Royal Marines, Royal Naval Reserve and Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve who were actually present on duty within range of the enemy's mobile artillery between the dates specified above.
- 4. The clasps earned by deceased Officers and men will be issued to their legatees or next of kin entitled to receive them.
- 5. Notification will be given when the roses and clasp are ready for issue, and no application should be made for them pending such notice.
- 6. The following units do not qualify for the clasp:-
 - (a) Transport Staffs.
 - (b) R.N. Hospital, Dunkirk.
 - (c) R.M. Brigade, Ostend.
 - (d) R.N.A.S., Dunkirk.
 - (e) R.N. Division, detachments at Dunkirk.R.N. Division, Divisional Engineers.R.N. Division, Divisional Train.

No Australian Order has been located that republishes Army Order No. 350 of 1917 referred to in Army Order 361 of 1919 below.

Army Order 361, 1919 - "1914 Star- Grant of Clasp"

- 1. His Majesty the King has been graciously pleased to approve of the issue of a clasp to officers, warrant officers, non-commissioned officers and men who have actually been awarded the '1914 Star' under Army Order 350 of 1917, and who actually served under fire of the enemy in France and Belgium between the 5th August, 1914, and midnight 22nd/ 23rd November, 1914.
- 2. The clasp will be in bronze and will bear the inscription: '5th Aug.-22nd Nov., 1914'.
- 3. Officers and soldiers who were actually present on duty within range of the enemy's mobile artillery and were on the strength of, or attached to the units and formations set forth in Appendix A between the above mentioned dates, will be eligible for the award.
- 4. An individual who served with a formation, otherwise than named in Appendix A, will only be granted the clasp on furnishing a certificate signed by an officer, warrant officer, or non-commissioned officer not below the rank of serjeant personally cognisant that the individual served on duty within a range of the enemy's mobile artillery during the period referred to in paragraph 1.
- 5. Two small silver roses will be issued with the clasp to each approved individual.
- 6. Officers commanding units and heads of departments will forward nominal rolls of troops now serving under their command entitled to the clasp, to the Secretary, War Office (AC 10), 27, Pilgrim Street, E.C.4. The rolls should be made out in duplicate in conformity with the specimen shown in Appendix B.
- 7. Individuals not now serving should apply on special forms (which can be obtained on application to any head or branch post office in a town or to any post office in the country districts), to the officer in charge of the record office of the corps in which they last served. If possible the certificate which is referred to in paragraph 5 (and which will be found on the form), should be first completed and signed as directed thereon. Officers in charge of records will forward all applications through the officer commanding the unit concerned, to the Secretary, War Office (AG 10), 27, Pilgrim Street, E.G.4. Applications made otherwise than on the prescribed form will be ignored.
