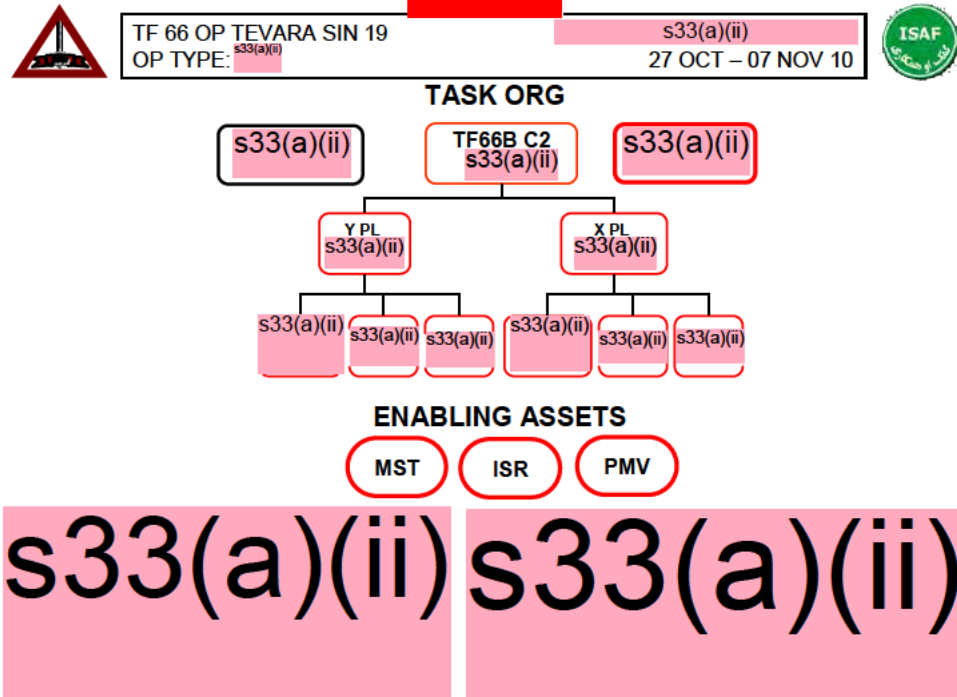


Figure 1. Composition of TF66-B for OP TVSN XIX.

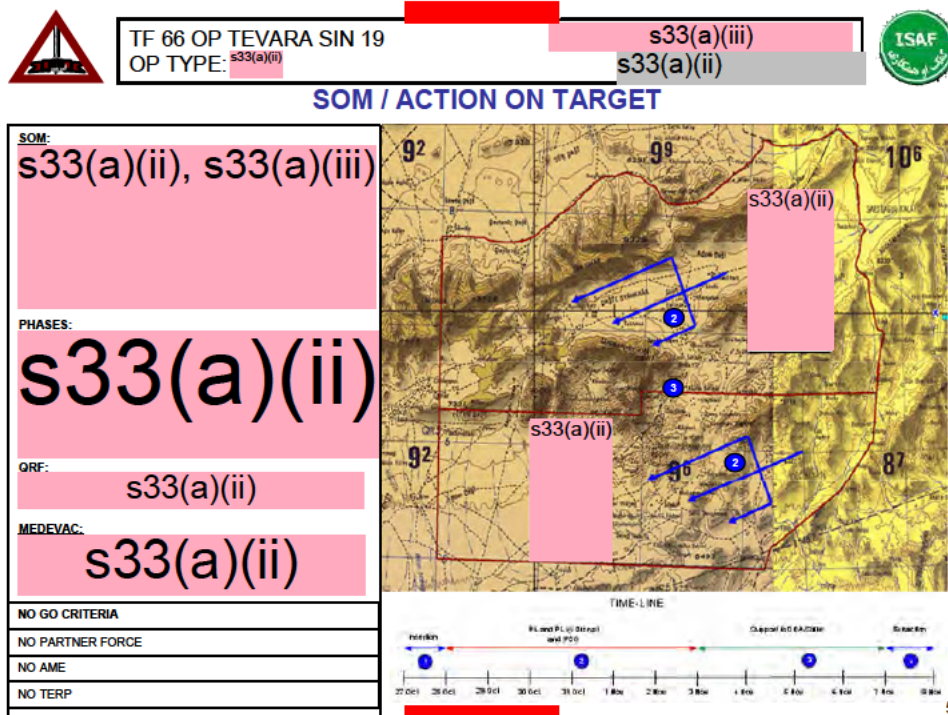


Figure 2. CONOP summary

Situation

4. This TG has been actively planning s33(a)(ii) in West SWK in order to maintain West SWK as an INS sanctuary and control the LN population. The INS also intend to continue to target the Pro – GIRoA village of Chenar which provides a large amount of MAM manning the s33(a)(ii). As a result of INS activity, s33(a)(ii). In Jul TF66 – B operations IVO Gumbad saw numerous INS swarm with at least 4 INS commanders controlling INS action identified by s33(a)(ii) During Aug TF66–B with s33(a)(iii) cleared Kundelan, with at least two INS commanders co-ordinating efforts identified with s33(a)(ii) and in Oct the clearance of Zangitan s33(a)(ii) INS activity IVO of Gumbaz. Coincidentally from recent TF66 operations conducted in the Khakrez district it was confirmed that INS from the s33(a)(ii) operate in both Khakrez and SWK districts and are actively planning operations to be conducted as far South as Arghandab. Additionally INS IVO Gumbad and Kundelan have been planning to s33(a)(ii) a reported ZPU variant and dushka. The INS are reportedly planning to conduct a SAFIRE activity IVO the Shah–e–Mardan Ghar mountain range.

Mission Statement

5. TF66 is to disrupt the s33(a)(ii) IVO W SWK from 27 Oct – 7 Nov 10 IOT protect the GLOC and northern approaches to KC.

Commander’s Intent

6. To protect the GLOC and northern approaches to KC

8. **Blue:** CF FoA/FoM is enhanced due to the disruption of INS leadership and IED facilitators. The battle space is shaped for future ISAF operations (HAMKARI), of note establishment of a SOTF South ^{s33(a)(ii)} site IVO Shah Wali Kot. FE B is re-postured at MNBTK ready for future tasking.

9. **Green:** ANSF capability is enhanced and the ANSFs capability to provide security is demonstrated in the eyes of LN.

10. **Red:** INS safe havens have been disrupted and INS network, caches, staging areas and C2 within SWK degraded. Complex attacks on LN/ANSF/CF are reduced ^{s33(a)(ii)}.

11. **White:** INS malign influence reduced and LN FoM enhanced. GIRoA strategic messaging accepted and support for and confidence in GIRoA/CF enhanced. INS C2 on the northern approaches to KC disrupted. The INS threat to the local population, GIROA and CF has been degraded through Intelligence led targeting of C2 nodes, IED facilitation networks, caches, safe havens and re-supply points.

26. At 29 0600DE Oct 10 a TF66 s33(a)(ii) IVO MGRS 42S TA 2598 7973, arriving at 0705DE. At 0750DE a TF66 s33(a)(ii) The TF66 recovery s33(a)(ii) at 0845DE and returned to MNBTK, arriving BTW at 0955DE.

27. At 29 0740DE Oct 10 TF66-B s33(a) departed the s33(a) RON loc and moved South West towards Kundelan. At 0840DE a PMV became U/S due to s33(a)(ii) s33(a)(ii). The issue was s33(a)(ii) continued to Kundelan at 0915DE.

28. At 0946DE TF66-B C/S were advised that s33(a)(ii) to re-commence with their respective SOM.

29. At 1300DE TF66-B s33(a) departed the s33(a) loc and re-commenced their movement to Kundelan. At 1341DE a large explosion was heard to the south of Kundelan. s33(a)(ii) indicated that the explosion was an IED set-off by a goat.

30. At 1445DE INS engaged TF66- s33(a)(ii) with sporadic SAF. This engagement was short in nature. An accurate point of origin was not able to be located.

31. At 1500DE the TF66- s33(a)(ii) at MGRS 41S QR 7720 6354 whilst an elem continued with a route clearance South West.

32. At 1513DE TF66-B(s33(a)(ii) located an IED and s33(a)(ii) at 1539DE.

33. TF66-B(s33(a)(ii) of the Kundelan green belt. A large amount of MAM movement was observed within Kundelan during the day, NSTR s33(a)(ii).

34. At 1545DE TF66-B(s33(a)(ii) IED strike on 28 Oct 10.

35. TF66-B(s33(a)(ii) commenced a clearance along the route expected to be used for infiltration towards Naveh on 30 Oct 10. During the clearance s33(a)(ii) located 2 x IED and s33(a)(ii).

36. At 1614DE s33(a)(ii) with TF66-B(s33(a)(ii) engaged a PID INS co-coordinating offensive action. The INS immediately took cover and was not observed again.

37. At 30 0430DE s33(a)(ii) from TF66-B(s33(a)(ii) posns IVO MGRS 41S QR 755 635.

38. At 0630DE TF66-B(s33(a)(ii) and moved into the Kundelan green belt. LNs reported that the individual who engaged TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) on 29 1806 Oct 10 has a mental disability and was not an INS. LNs offered to bring the individual to meet with TF66-B(s33(a)(ii) .

39. At 0730DE C/S s33(a) PID INS spotters co-ordinating offensive action against TF66-B. At 0754DE TF66-B(sⁱⁱⁱ) engaged the PID INS spotters. The INS spotters were engaged IVO MGRS 41S QR 76025 62515. A s33(a)(ii) and confirmed 2 x EKIA.

40. At 0750DE TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) damaged in the IED strike on 28 Oct 10.

41. At 0800DE TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) and moved West towards Naveh.

42. At 0849DE TF66-B(s³) reported an IED find IVO MGRS 42S TA 1927 7856 and s33(a)(ii).

43. At 0915DE TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) moved to compound s33(a)(ii) and s33(a)(ii) to s33(a)(ii) after observing an increase in MAM movement, NSTR.

44. At 0857DE TF66-B(s³) reported a possible IED at MGRS 76156 63138. The IED was described as tape suspended in a tree (a possible command pull) leading to fresh mud in the wall where the main charge was possibly located. The IED was s33(a)(ii).

45. At 0935DE s33(a)(ii) and TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) attended a Shura IVO MGRS 41S QR 7642 6292 with 40 x MAM attending and 4 s33(a)(ii). At 0950DE the Shura was complete with a s33(a)(ii) (ii)

46. At 1000DE TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) and s33(a)(ii) elems moved IVO MGRS 768 630 to conduct a second Shura with village elders. During the conduct of this Shura C/S TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) moved to clear and exploit a cave system IVO MGRS 41S QR 76154 63369 then moved East and clearing compounds s33(a)(ii) and s33(a)(ii) NSTR.

47. During the conduct of both Shura's s33(a)(ii) PID INS spotters co-ordinating offensive action IVO MGRS 41S QR 7690 6293. The individual was using children as a shield and was unable to be engaged.

48. At 1015DE TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) found s33(a)(ii) an IED.

49. At 1110DE TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) found s33(a)(ii) an IED.

50. At 1140DE the Shura was completed with TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) by 1230DE.

51. At 1218DE TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) found s33(a)(ii) an IED.

52. At 1445DE TF66-B(s³) established s33(a)(ii) MGRS 41S QR 77210 75400, to await s33(a)(ii).

53. At 1500DE the s33(a)(ii) for TF66-B with s33(a)(ii) and 2 x detainees were back loaded to MNBTK. TF66-B remained s33(a)(ii) and commenced their task at F/L.

54. [REDACTED] s33(a)(ii)

55. At 0800DE TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) departed the s33(a)(ii) and moved into the Kundelan green belt to conduct a s33(a)(ii) with the local populace. The s33(a)(ii) knew members of the community and led the Shura. The locals repeated the same themes to come out of previous Shura's; that additional s33(a)(ii) are required. They requested a check point from s33(a)(ii) to Kundelan in order to support their rejection of the Taliban. Throughout the s33(a)(ii) LNs continued to state that Gumbad is an operating base for Taliban.

56. TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) continued with their movements towards the village of Naveh at first light. At 0840DE an IED functioned IVO TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) MGRS 41S QR 752 732, after being activated by a camel. A Kuchi mbr responded to the s33(a)(ii) incident and stepped on a second IED killing him instantly. s33(a)(ii) members responded to the incident, NSTR. INS ICOM stated LNs are to stay indoors due to the IED threat and stated that LNs were responsible for their own lives.

57. TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) conducted a s33(a)(ii) in Kundelan from 1430DE. LNs reported similar issues to those previously reported and re-enforced their concerns for INS retribution once TF66-B depart. s33(a)(ii) members questioned three suspicious MAMs after over hearing them listening to an INS channel. Questioning revealed that the MAMs were listening on SW radio for their situational awareness.

58. TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) IVO s33(a)(ii). At 1330DE, the ptl found between 150-200kg of ammonium nitrate and possible mixing apparatus in compound s33(a)(ii). Upon further inspection s33(a)(ii), the ammonium nitrate was assessed to be of an illegal nature.

59. At 01 0800DE Nov 10 TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) commenced a deliberate clearance towards Zangitan. This clearance ceased at 1000DE due to the high IED threat in the immediate vicinity. s33(a)(ii) was then moved South s33(a)(ii) to re-commence a deliberate clearance South towards Zangitan.

60. At 0800DE a TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) South IVO Naveh. At 0850DE an IED detonated approximately 3m from the dismantled C/S at MGRS 41S QR 7426 7107 with nil injuries occurring from the blast. Reporting indicated that it was s33(a)(ii). TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) continued South and secured a s33(a)(ii) IVO MGRS 41S QR 740705.

61. At 1145DE TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) commenced team level disruption patrol with elms establishing s33(a)(ii) IVO MGRS 41S QR 759 640 s33(a)(ii) on villages West of Kundelan.

62. At 1300DE TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) s33(a)(ii)

NSTR.

63. At 1300DE s33(a)(ii) led a dismantled patrol into Western Kundelan. Elms s33(a)(ii) for the patrol IVO MGRS 41S QR 7585 6277. s33(a)(ii) conducted a clearance of several compounds in the vicinity, NSTR. s33(a)(ii) noted a lack of MAMs in the area. LNs

reported that MAMs had travelled to Kandahar in order to sell figs. At 1543DE s33(a)(ii) led the patrol back to s33(a)(ii). s33(a)(ii) NSTR. All C/S arrived back in the s33(a)(ii) at 1630DE.

64. TF66-B s33(a)(ii) continued dismantled patrols IVO Naveh throughout the day, NSTR.

65. At approx 02 0300DE TF66-B s33(a)(ii) s33(a)(ii) They returned to the s33(a)(ii) at approx 0730DE, NSTR.

66. At 0800DE TF66-B s33(a)(ii) South to Zangitan. This move took longer than expected due to the high IED threat and complex terrain. At 1330DE TF66-B s33(a)(ii) at MGRS 41S QR 7630 5913 and immediately s33(a)(ii). The s33(a)(ii) to Zangitan was completed without incident with high spotter activity during the conduct of the move.

67. At 1000DE and 1430DE TF66-B s33(a)(ii) conducted Shura's led by s33(a)(ii) with the LNs IVO Kenjakak.

68. At 1445DE s33(a)(ii) commenced a patrol into Zangitan in order to establish a time to conduct a Shura for 03 Nov 10. s33(a)(ii).

69. At 1500DE s33(a)(ii). During extraction from the TF66-B s33(a)(ii), MGRS 41S QR 73859 70682, s33(a)(ii) by 5 rounds of SAF, NFTR. s33(a)(ii) South with the addition s33(a)(ii) loaded to MNBTK.

70. At 1600DE TF66-B s33(a)(ii) conducted a Shura IVO Naveh with LNs. Around 25 MAMs attended the Shura.

71. TF66-B s33(a)(ii) conducted a deliberate compound clearance of s33(a)(ii) IVO MGRS 41S QR 7406 7054.

72. At 1711de TF66-B s33(a)(ii) were engaged by 3 x IDF 107mm rockets from MGRS 41S QR 7472 6053. The FE engaged s33(a)(ii) the EN posn s33(a)(ii). A s33(a)(ii) involved in co-ordinating the IDF attack was cleared by s33(a)(ii) 7 x MAM s33(a)(ii), NSTR. TF66-B s33(a)(ii) of the IDF attack with s33(a)(ii) under s33(a)(ii) at 2032DE. s33(a)(ii) from s33(a)(iii) reported no civilian property damage and no civilian casualties. s33(a)(ii) at first light on 03 Nov 10.

73. At 2042DE C/S TF66-B s33(a)(ii) located 6 x kharez holes in compounds at MGRS 74733 59773. This C/S had secured the area to await s33(a)(ii) to conduct further exploitation. At 2115DE TF66-B s33(a)(ii) to MUP with TF66-B s33(a)(ii) to conduct further exploitation through the POD 02/03 Nov 10 on the kharez system.

74. a) Through further exploitation of the area, it was confirmed this system was a man made cave system not a kharez as previously thought. s33(a)(ii) exploited the cave system and

estimated it to be approx 100m in length. The 2 x weapons wrapped in blankets found were a .303 rifle with ammunition and a WWII style machine gun, NFTR.

75. At **03 0050DE** all TF66-B^{s33(a)(ii)} C/S were complete back in ^{s33(a)(ii)}. Entrance to the cave system was ^{s33(a)(ii)} NFTR.

76. At **0522DE** the TF66-B^{s33(a)(ii)} conducted ^{s33(a)(ii)} led first light clearances of COI IVO **MGRS 41S QR 7421 6888** and **41S QR 7404 6886**, NSTR.

77. At **0522DE** TF66-B^{s33(a)(ii)} conducted ^{s33(a)(ii)} first light led clearances o ^{s33(a)(ii)} IVO **MGRS 41S QR 7318 7429**, NSTR.

78. At **0612DE** a young LN male approached TF66-B^{s33(a)(ii)} ^{s33(a)(ii)}. He was visibly shaken as the Taliban were trying to kill him. Subsequently TF66-B^{s33(a)(ii)} provided this particular individual protection.

79. At **0815DE** TF66-B^{s33(a)(ii)} was conducted on ^{s33(a)(ii)}, NSTR. After these clearances the patrol rtd to the designated strong point. IVO Safi there are significant underground watercourses supplying the village with an abundance of good quality water for both consumption and irrigation. Note - this is in stark contrast to Kenjakak. Safi is populated by the Barakzai tribe. There are mosque's located at ^{s33(a)(ii)} and ^{s33(a)(ii)}

80. At **0900DE** TF66-B^{s33(a)(ii)} conducted a Shura in Zangitan. During the Shura, LNs described a poss cache location that was IVO ^{s33(a)(ii)} positions at that time. LNs stated a group of 6-10 INS on motorcycles had been in the Zangitan area 5-6 days ago but had not been seen since. LNs also reported that they believed that IEDS had been emplaced on the road to the N/W of Zangitan close to the TF66-B^{s33(a)(ii)}.

81. At **0940DE** TF66-B^{s33(a)(ii)} searched ^{s33(a)(ii)} with NSTR.

82. At **1100DE** an INS was PID moving into Zangitan on a motorcycle to re-fuel. TF66-B^{s33(a)(ii)} vectored onto the MAM riding the motorcycle. TF66-B^{s33(a)(ii)} approached the last seen location the MAM and motorcycle IVO ^{s33(a)(ii)} compound at **MGRS 41S QR 73915 57125**. Upon searching the compound, TF66-B^{s33(a)(ii)} located a motorcycle with a warm engine, hidden under blankets in a back room. The MAM previously observed was also located Inside the compound. The POIs motorcycle had been reconfigured with est INS TTP of disconnected headlights and charger for phone. The POI tested positive for Picric Acid and nitrates. The POI was found to have an ICOM receiver currently on an INS frequency. The POI also had a device (electric bike horn) that was assessed to be most likely used as a continuity tester for IED emplacing / construction. The ICOM receiver and motorcycle ^{s33(a)(ii)}. The POI is currently held by TF66-B ^{s33(a)(ii)} and will be further screened. ^{s33(a)(ii)}

83. At **1115DE** TF66-B^{s33(a)(ii)} discovered a cache IVO the area described by LNs during a Shura. The cache consisted of an un-opened liner of 7.62mm rnds hidden under a pile of rocks. ^{s33(a)(ii)} continued with a search of the area with NFTR. The cache was replaced ^{s33(a)(ii)}

s33(a)(ii)

the following day.

84. Throughout the afternoon TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) led patrol to exploit caves located in the S/W region of Zangitan, NSTR. All TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) C/S were complete in the (s33(a)(ii)) at **1530DE**.

85. At **1335DE** a Shura was conducted as the LNs did not show for the Shura planned at **1000DE**. The Shura was held IVO Naveh.

86. At **1535DE** elem of TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) declared TIC. Patrols on the Eastern bank of the Mandra were engaged by two groups of INS by SAF.

87. At **1625DE** (s33(a)(ii)) INS move via 4 x motorcycles to an RV at **MGRS 41S QR 73007 65217**. INS were then observed to move to a second RV IVO of a mosque, **MGRS 41S QR 72370 64517**. Weapons were then seen to be cached in compounds (s33(a)(ii)) IVO **MGRS 41S QR 72431 64429**. At **1653DE** the TIC was declared closed.

88. At **1630DE** elms of TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) a dismounted patrol to search local wells, possible kharez systems and abandoned compounds. During the patrol an IED was located IVO **MGRS 41S QR 7456 7386** (s33(a)(ii)) at **1750DE**.

89. At approx **1720DE** 2 x INS were PID armed with RPG/PKM on a motorbike. These insurgents were (s33(a)(ii)) at **1808DE** IVO **MGRS 41S QR 69922 61156**. The (s33(a)(ii)) confirmed 1 x EKIA and 1 x EWIA. The EWIA was recovered by another MAM and moved to a compound IVO **MGRS 41S QR 69934 60947**. No civilian casualties or damage to civilian infrastructure occurred during this engagement.

90. During POD (s33(a)(ii)) elms from TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) attempted to insert into an abandoned compound to interdict INS attempting to engage the TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)). During infill, (s33(a)(ii)) at **0730DE**. The element continued on with a patrol route throughout the morning.

91. At **0545DE** a patrol from the TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) was conducted IVO the IED site (s33(a)(ii)) at **03 1750DE**. The intent was to ensure all LNs were aware of the IED location and that the road was still not safe for foot or vehicle travel. At **0615DE** the area was secured (s33(a)(ii)) to determine whether the IED site had been altered through POD 03/04 Nov. The site had not been altered overnight - (s33(a)(ii)) 2 x mortar rounds which were exposed, NFTR.

92. At **0630DE** (s33(a)(ii)) IVO the NE side of the belly button feature for an operation to recover / exploit a repeater used for targeting CF and tgt spotter locs. During this operation, no spotters were ID and the repeater was successfully recovered IVO **MGRS 41S QR 69341 68360** (s33(a)(ii)).

93. The 2 x antennas for the INS retrans were located approx 50 meters apart. The antennas consisted of an up turned umbrella metal skeleton, minus the fabric that were attached to sticks. The antennas led to a box by a coax cable which was completely hidden and protected by rocks within a recess of larger rocks. The box unit which was wrapped in plastic appeared to be a

broken down ICOM of sorts. The box ran to a 12 volt heavy duty truck battery which in turn led to a solar panel.

94. The solar panel, 2 x rudimentary antennas, a set of pliers and box were retrieved and are presently in s33(a)(ii) for the chain of evidence sequence to follow. The battery and all coax cables s33(a)(ii).

95. No other repeaters were located or disrupted s33(a)(ii).

96. At 0710DE TF66-B(s) departed s33(a)(ii) IVO Zangitan after completion of s33(a)(ii) of 1 x detainee, to conduct s33(a)(ii) South to vic of Qudus and Shawkal. TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) IVO MGRS 41S QR 72520 55251. s33(a)(ii) with s33(a)(ii) departing to conduct the clearance of respective areas at 1000DE.

97. The TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) in Riyal with s33(a)(ii) with NSTR. The occupant of the s33(a)(ii) was identified during the Shura as a low level TB shooter by a LN. The Shura was conducted at 1100DE with 22 older men in attendance. They asked TF66-B to leave the area - otherwise NSTR.

98. At 1000DE TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) commenced a simultaneous clearance IVO Qudus, Shawkal, Abddul Wahid and Pirew Khan. The s33(a)(ii) identified and pursued suspicious individuals on motorcycles at 1100DE. The s33(a)(ii) engaged the INS after they s33(a)(ii) avenue of approach. The INS returned fire and fled South discarding their motorcycles IVO compound s33(a)(ii) s33(a)(ii) observed the individuals make their way to a series of compounds IVO s33(a)(ii) s33(a)(ii) cleared the compound and located the INS motorcycles but were unable to locate the INS. s33(a)(ii) continued their clearance South to s33(a)(ii) where the clearance was halted - NSTR. s33(a)(ii) ceased this task and re-commenced their task of Pirow Khan.

99. s33(a)(ii) s33(a)(ii) observed significant act IVO a fort located at MGRS 41S QR 730 543. At 1307DE TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) to conduct a clearance of the fort and compounds in that vicinity.

100. At 1330DE TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) began a clearance of compounds and the fort IVO MGRS 41S QR 730 542, NSTR.

101. At 1350DE s33(a)(ii) a significant amount of MAM movement from N to S was being observed in the N-S river bed running from MGRS 41S QR 707 575 to 41S QR 707 530.

102. At 1400DE TF66-B(s33(a)(ii)) clearing the village of Molla Adro Nikeh. At 1424DE s33(a)(ii) discovered a small cache in a tree at MGRS 7341 5472. The cache consisted of 2 x elec dets and qty of det cord. A thorough search of the area was conducted with NSTR.

103. During the clearance of Molla Adro Nikeh 4 x MAMs (3 x brothers and father) were questioned by s33(a)(ii). The father of the MAMs stated that he knew Mattiolah Khan well and was celebrating the upcoming EID with him. The village was described by mentors as

relatively affluent with large amounts of figs and good water reserves. Some compounds were complete with lighting and solar power.

104. At **1455DE** TF66-B^{s33(a)(ii)} PID an armed spotter IVO **MGRS 74866 69779** and engaged the insurgent. ^{s33(a)(ii)} the PID armed spotter and confirmed 1 x EKIA.

105. At **1500DE** the TF66-B^{s33(a)(ii)}, departed ^{s33(a)(ii)} to conduct a patrol to search abandoned compounds and kharez systems to the N of Kenjakak and Bazek. During the patrol, it was observed that the pressure plate from the IED ^{s33(a)(ii)} 03 Nov 10 that was left still buried in the ground had been recovered by an unknw pers. The pressure plate could not be removed earlier by TF66-B due to ^{s33(a)(ii)}.

106. TF66-B^{s33(a)(ii)} conducted a ^{s33(a)(ii)} IVO the Southern FE ^{s33(a)(ii)}. During the search ^{s33(a)(ii)} located a cache, details below. TF66-B^{s33(a)(ii)} then returned to ^{s33(a)(ii)}.

107. At **05 0545DE** TF66-B^{s33(a)(ii)} led patrol to the village of Safi with ^{s33(a)(ii)} in support. Once IVO of the Safi, the patrol ^{s33(a)(ii)}. Throughout the patrol normal pattern of life was observed within both sectors.

108. At **0630DE** ^{s33(a)(ii)} members indicated possible INS movement to the North of Safi. The patrol ^{s33(a)(ii)} to interdict the POI. Once the patrol ^{s33(a)(ii)} and the POI, it was determined that they were Kuchi with NSTR. It was observed that there were a large amount of un-funded water pumps in operation. In addition, defensive stores that have been provided to the LNs, such as hesco, were used as fences to house live stock.

109. At **0800DE** TF66-B^{s33(a)(ii)} departed ^{s33(a)(ii)} to conduct a clearance of a village IVO Mohammad Ali and at **0930DE** TF66-B^{s33(a)(ii)} discovered a weapons cache at **MGRS 41S QR 73929 56942**.

110. At **0828DE** the TF66-B^{s33(a)(ii)} collapsed ^{s33(a)(ii)} and commenced a ^{s33(a)(ii)} IVO Kenjakak. 2 x teams remained behind as ^{s33(a)(ii)} IVO **MGRS 41S QR 742 709**. MAMs were observed in the area however none were identified to be carrying weapons. The teams moved North and ^{s33(a)(ii)} at **1800DE** with the remainder of TF66-B^{s33(a)(ii)}.

111. At **1400DE** a ^{s33(a)(ii)} was extracted to MNBTK ^{s33(a)(ii)}. A member involved in the IED strike on 28 Oct 10 was extracted due to the degradation of a minor shoulder injury over the previous few days.

112. At **0800DE** TF66-B elems departed ^{s33(a)(ii)} to conduct a ^{s33(a)(ii)} to MNBTK. TF66-B^{s33(a)(ii)} moved NE through the Tanachuy valley and TF66-B^{s33(a)(ii)} moved SE through Black Mountain pass.

113. At **0905DE** TF66-B^{s33(a)(ii)} conducted a ^{s33(a)(ii)} on a PID INS spotter co-ordinating offensive action against their C/S. There was no CIVCAS or collateral damage throughout the engagement. A ^{s33(a)(ii)} identified nil

movement in the immediate impact area. However, 1 x MAM was seen moving away approx 700m from the engagement site. No further ICOM indications were received post mission from the spotter's location.

114. At **1115DE** TF66-B(s3 est s33(a) IVO MGRS 42S TA 2181 7887. s33(a)(ii) then proceeded south along s33(a)(ii) to s33(a)(ii) IVO Wecht Baghtu/Baghtu. Upon arriving in the area, it was observed that there is s33(a)(ii) and the mouth of the Wecht Baghtu valley.

115. At **1246DE**, s33(supporting the TF66-B(s3 SOM located an IED IVO MGRS 41S QR 7572 5476. s33(a)(ii)

116. At **1400DE**, the TF66-B(s33(a)(ii) found a 20Kg HME PPIED IVO MGRS 42S TA 188 539 s33(a)(ii) . The IED s33(a)(ii) . s33(a)(ii) then moved North s33(a)(ii) with the remainder of the C/S. TF66-B s33(a)(ii) arrived back at MNBTK at **1606DE**.

117. Once all TF66-B(s33(a)(ii) to MNBTK arriving at **1605DE**.

118. At **1925DE** TF66-B(s3 s33(a)(ii) North to MNBTK. 3(

119. At **2020DE** one of the TF66-B(s33(a)(ii) its wheels out of alignment. At **2048DE** veh mechanics s33(a)(ii))(ii) and re-commenced moving North to MNBTK.
