

- 1. **Purpose.** To **seek your endorsement** of the proposed design of the Army Aviation Command (AVNCOMD) Pennant.
- 2. Recommendation. It is recommended you:
- a. **endorse** the introduction of the HQ AVNCOMD Pennant as proposed within this brief.

ENDORSED / PLEASE DISCUSS

3. **Background.** In July 21 you endorsed the HQ AVNCOMD unit colour patch (UCP) and unit shoulder patch (USP) (Reference A). That brief noted that approval for the Command pennant would be sought separately as a design had not yet been finalised.

4. **Discussion.** The AVNCOMD UCP and USP have been introduced and well received. As such the proposed AVNCOMD pennant is identical to the USP. The proposed pennant is shown graphically at **FLAG A**. Design principles are consistent with those used for other functional Command pennants as described in Reference B. These include:

- a. **Colours**. The designs retains the original colours of the Australian Flying Corps of scarlet, sky blue and royal blue. This maintains a linkage through to the current aviation capability by including the corps colours of AAAvn. Some of these colours are also common in other major represented corps such as RAA, RAEME, RACT and RAAOC. Scarlet (military red) is also the colour of the Australian Army in tri-service motifs.
- b. **Structure.** The pennant design is rectangular and structured around a two layer, horizontal arrangement similar to that of the FORCOMD pennant.
- c. **Symbol**. As one of Australia's national emblems, the Kangaroo is seen as symbolic to Army Aviation, and would be reconsisted within international settings. The kangaroo symbol to be used is the same as that used on Navy, Army and Air Force aircraft IAW AAP 7021.004-1 Aircraft Finishing Schemes, Materials and Processes. The symbol binds the functional command with the units it supports.
- d. The Commanders car plate will be the standard Army pattern of chrome stars on scarlet.
- 5. **Conclusion.** The proposed identity was selected as it appropriately represents all elements, including national symbolism and tri service links, history, future and *raison d'etre* of Aviation Command. Endorsement of the proposed design is requested
