



THE LARGE NUMBER OF INS IN COMPARISON TO THE RELATIVELY SMALL NUMBER OF FAMILIES IN THE AREA COULD EXPLAIN THE EXTENT OF THE DEPLETION OF FOOD, ETC AND THE REASON FOR THE RESENTMENT TOWARD THE TB.

LN'S STILL REMAIN FEARFUL OF TB RETRIBUTION. THERE HAS ALSO BEEN FURTHER INFORMATION GAINED INDICATING A LARGE INS PRESENCE IN AND AROUND LWAR CHAGNEY.






Figure 1. Composition of TF66-B for OP TVSN VII.

2. The composition for TF66-B \$33(a)(ii) during is OP TVSN VII is detailed in figure 1.

#### **Situation**

4. COMD RC(S) ME is to protect the population of KC from INS influence. ISAF SOF has been tasked as part of HAMKARI to disrupt INS safe-havens and deny FoM in key terrain as outlined in Ref A.

#### **Mission Statement**

5. TF66-B and s33(a)(ii) is to DISRUPT the INS TG network within CHENARTU during the period 10 - 15 Jun 10 IOT protect the population within URZ and SWK and enhance security and FoM along Route BEAR and protect the northern approaches to KC.

### **Commander's Intent**

### **Purpose**

6. The purpose of this operation is to protect the population within URZ and SWK; enhance the security and FoM along Route Bear and protect the northern approaches to KC.

#### Method

- 7. This operation supports COMD RC(S) \$33() by disrupting INS safe-havens impacting on the security of KC and Route BEAR. TF06i) will undermine the INS ability to conduct operations that threaten the northern approaches to KAF through the following:
  - a. deny INS SA s33(a)(ii)
  - b. functionally and physically dislocate the INS EAs / IED belt by \$33(a)(ii);
  - c. disrupt the INS network and protect the population through ;
  - d. conduct \$33(a)(ii) IOT undermine the INS influence; and
  - e. embolden the population to reject TB influence through the conduct of COE at local and regional level.

#### **End State**

- 8. **Red.** INS safe havens will be disrupted and population centres. The disruption of these identified TAIs will establish a short to medium term disrupt on INS ability to conduct IED manufacturing and distribution. Complex attacks on LN/ANSF/CF will reduce along ROUTE BEAR.
- 9. **Blue.** TF66 will conduct disrupt operations IOT positively shape the battlespace ISO HAMKARI. CF FoA/FoM is enhanced due to the disruption of INS leadership and IED facilitators and s33(a)(ii) with the INS link between SWK and KC.

- 10. **Green.** ANSF capability is practically enhanced and ANSF capability to provide security is demonstrated in the eyes of LN.
- 11. White. INS malign influence reduced and LN FoM enhanced. GIRoA strategic messaging accepted and support for and confidence in GIRoA/CF enhanced.

# **Concept of Operations**

12. This operation was conducted in 5 phases:

a. Phase 1: B66 - s33(a)(ii) s33(a)(ii)

b. Phase 2: B66 - \$33(a)(ii) \$33(a)(ii)

c. Phase 3: B66 - s33(a)(ii)

d. Phase 4: B66 – \$33(a)(ii); and

e. Phase 5: B66 - \$33(a)(ii) \$33(a)(ii).



29. Post attack, the INS were then observed withdrawing South through the greenbelt. The INS conducting the assault on TAI s33(a)(ii) demonstrated a great deal of resolve as well as a high level of individual and collective skills and discipline. This group of INS were well trained in their application of fire and use of ground. All SAF was accurate and effective. The attack was well synchronised with the suppression of s33(a)(ii) to the West and the nearby s33(a)(ii) position to the North East. The INS displayed little regard for LNs and the Mosque IVO of the COE being conducted by s33(a). Total INS numbers, including those in the high ground, were estimated to be approximately 30 - 40.



- 32. \$33(a) received SAF from the South and East, including sniper fire from the West and \$33(a) received SAF from the North and North West. Sporadic engagement continued for approx 30 min, with \$33(a)(ii) providing surgical fire throughout the attack.
- Approximately 30 minutes after the main assault on FE B an INS MG position, with two INS, were observed in the high ground MGRS 42STA 35874 59119. At approx 1820DE, C/S s33(a)(ii) engaged the

INS position s33(a)(ii) resulting in 3 x EKIA.

34. During \$33(a)(ii) 10/11 Jun 10, \$33(a questioned 10 x FAMs during the conduct of the clearances of TAI s33(a)(ii) and TAI s33(a)(ii), with 3 x POI being released and 7 x POI subsequently detained.





Figure 3.s33(a)(ii)






Figure 6. s33(a TIC PM 10 Jun 10.





Figure 9. **s33**( TIC 10 Jun 10. )(ii)



- 43. During AM 12 JUN 10, reporting indicated that INS believed the FE had \$\frac{\s33(a)(ii)}{\text{concurrently}}\$. Concurrently, LNs started to foot move back into the CHENARTU greenbelt from the South. At approx 0930DE, an INS spotter was PID with \$\frac{\s33(a)}{\text{iii}}\$ and reporting IVO MGRS 42STA 3714 6093 and \$\frac{\s33(a)(ii)}{\text{iii}}\$ South of TAI \$\frac{\s33(a)(ii)}{\text{concurrently}}\$ (MGRS 42STA 372 609). Due to the tactical situation \$\frac{\s33(a)(ii)}{\text{iii}}\$ LNs were again seen leaving the village areas and moving South.
- 44. Throughout the remainder of 12 Jun 10, \$33(a)(ii) conducted a shura IVO TAI \$33(a)(ii) The results of the shura included:
  - a. 9 x LNs attended COE, and

- b. 9 x LNs s33(a)(ii)
- 45. The general atmospherics from the SHURA included:
  - a. LNs were fearful of CF targeting \$\frac{\$\si33(a)}{\text{iii}}\$ and of CF arresting LN FAMs;
  - b. the LNs indicated that the LN FAMs were scared of being detained and had moved North and North East of CHENARTU to vic SAR KALAY and MABANG KALAY. In all, LNs indicated approx 70 – 80 LN FAMs had fled; and
  - c. towards the end of the shura they felt safe enough around CF to ask if they could coerce their relatives to return to their villages.
- 46. At approximately 1600DE, \$33( and C/S \$33( conducted \$33(a)(ii) positions IVO TAI \$33(a)(ii) this move was in preparation of the next phase and clearance north towards ADAMKHAN KALAY. Due to the difficult terrain, \$33(a)(ii) was in location at 13 0345DE Jun 10.
- 47. Throughout the remainder of 12 Jun 10, \$33(a) indicated the INS trying to establish contact with other parties, however a number of INS remained silent through either being KIA or not wanting to answer.

#### Phase 3

- 48. At approximately 13 0320DE Jun 10, \$33(a)(ii) commenced a \$33(a)(ii) to TAI \$33(a)(ii) At 0402DE, \$33(a) conducted \$33(a)(ii) of TAI \$33(a)(ii) The results included:
  - a. TAI s33(a)(ii) \_s33(a)(ii)
  - b. a further 14 x FAMs discovered around the cordon;

  - d. biometric enrolment of 20 x FAMs; and

- 49. At 0629DE, s33(a) conducted s33(a)(ii) of TAI s33(a)(ii) The s33(a)(iii) , including 4 x FAMs found on the outer cordon. After s33(a)(ii) , all POI were released with NSTR s33(a)(ii)
- 50. At 0715DE, C/S \$\frac{\mathbf{s}33(\mathbf{a})(\mathbf{i})}{\mathbf{a}} at MGRS 42STA 349 632, PID 1 x INS with a weapon approximately 400m to the west of their position \$\frac{\mathbf{s}33(\mathbf{a})(\mathbf{i})}{\mathbf{a}}\$. The INS was WIA but managed to withdraw to the West, \$\frac{\mathbf{s}33(\mathbf{a})}{\mathbf{i}\mathbf{i}}\$ indicated a significant blood trail.



- 52. During the \$33(a)(ii) \$33(a) indicated that INS were trying to ascertain the FE dispositions. INS indicated that they were not going to try and reinforce ADAMKHAN KALAY as all approaches are covered by CF. The INS also indicated not to try and place weapons down and move into the village area and blend in as LNs, as the CF are "smart Americans" and it will not work.
- 53. During the \$33(a)(ii) of the valley towards ADAMKHAN KALAY, the FE was directed to \$33(a)(ii) of SPIN KECHA. On \$33(a)(ii) of TAI \$33(a) the FE consolidated IVO TAI \$33(a)(ii) in preparation for \$33(a)(ii) to SPIN KECHA. With temperatures over 50 deg in the high ground, \$33(a)(ii) into TAI \$33(a)(ii) at approximately 1630DE.



- 14 Jun 10, the FE commenced \$33(a)(ii) of TAI s33(a)(ii) resulting in NSTR and s33(a)(ii) The FE then commenced a s33(a)(ii) towards and including SPIN KECHA. During \$33(a)(ii) on TAI s33(a)(ii) s33(a)(ii) occupants and NSTR. On completion \$33(a)(ii) transitioned to PCO and engaged with the LNs. LNs from TAI \$33(a)(ii) claim to have little to do with the TB. The LNs claim the TB come about once a week for food and water in groups of two to ten. LNs stated the TB have a combination of local language and accents they couldn't understand. The atmospherics towards the FE presence through SPIN KECHA indicated the LNs were scared on seeing CF. LNS explained this was due to \$33(a)(ii) IVO SPIN KECHA.

57. The FE s33(a)(ii) IVO HLZ s33(a)(ii) on completion of PCO for the remainder of the day. At approximately 2200DE, the FE s33(a)(ii) s33(a)(ii) arriving successfully at MNB-TK.



### **OC TF66 B Comments**

63. OP TVSN VII IVO Chenatu was the culmination of an operational sequence conducted \$33(a)(ii)

Initial operations in SWK identified the information deficit that needed to be rectified if the TG network within the region was to be effectively disrupted. This void was filled through \$33(a)(ii)

The information gained was rapidly exploited through and force the INS network to concentrate within their traditional safe haven areas such as the Chenatu Valley. OP TVSN VII was designed to be the decisive action against the INS TG network within SWK whereby TF66-B would \$33(a)(ii) the INS safe haven \$33(a)(ii) the INS TG and connect with the population. - 66. Over the following three days the Company \$\frac{\sqrt{33(a)(ii)}}{\text{chanatu Tangay}}\$ north, clearing TAIs IVO the Chanatu Tangay and subsequently south clearing the TAIs IVO Spin Kecha and southern Chenatu Valley. During these operations the FE connected further with the population and developed a detailed understanding of the tribal dynamics within the region identifying that northern Chenatu was certainly far more tribally homogeneous and Toki based. This is significant as it is the tribally fragmented nature of southern Chenatu that make it open to exploitation by the TB and it is therefore northern Chenatu that is better suited to \$\frac{\sqrt{33(a)(ii)}}{\sqrt{533(a)(ii)}}\$. Spin Kecha and Southern Chenartu were virtually devoid of civilians during \$\frac{\sqrt{33(a)(ii)}}{\sqrt{533(a)(ii)}}\$ in this area. This further confirms the assessment that the Southern Chenartu/Spin Kecha area is more likely to be the physical centre of the insurgency within SWK as apposed to the Chenartu Valley itself.
- 67. Conditions faced throughout the operation were challenging with temperatures in the high \$33(a)(ii) of 50 degrees during the day and an average temperature of over 45 degrees throughout the valley. The terrain itself was rugged and dominating demanding that \$33(a)(ii) deny the terrain to the INS. The FE conducted \$33(a)(ii) from the northern extremity of the De Chenatu Tangay to Spin Kecha on little sleep and with only \$33(a)(ii) . This was a domination of the area at a level that has not previously been seen by the INS who struggled to maintain awareness of the FE dispositions and were completely overwhelmed by the actions.
- 68. Overall OP TVSN VII has been successful on a scale that had not been anticipated on inception and has vindicated the operational sequence developed and executed that has resulted in not only the enduring disruption but the neutralisation of the INS TG in SWK. The actions of TF66-B during this operation have demonstrated the ability of TF66 to force project into and deny INS safe havens and sanctuary areas, separate the INS from the population and promoted GIROA legitimacy. It has resulted in the almost complete capitulation of the INS network in E

SWK at a level that is unprecedented in the area. In doing so TF66-B has demonstrated a sophisticated operational design involving the full spectrum of SOF tasks.

#### **CO TF66 Comments**

69. The results from these series of strikes has undoubtedly struck a severe blow to the INS on the Eastern SWK side of RTE BEAR which will potentially mean that they will be largely ineffective this fighting season. Of particular note is the number of out of area fighters who were involved in \$33(a)(ii) CHENARTU. There is clearly a linkage between SWK and ZABUL Province that \$33(a)(ii)

worked exceptionally well providing COMD
